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How do you feel? - grammar

Remember

In inglese si usa il verbo **to be**, non *to have*: *I **am** hungry* (ho fame), *She **is** scared* (ha paura).

Per chiedere: *How do you feel?* / *How are you feeling?*

Aggettivi in **-ed** descrivono chi prova l'emozione: *I am bored*. Aggettivi in **-ing** descrivono ciò che la provoca: *The film is boring*.
